NEW STANDARD DRESS GUIDELINES

White Settlement ISD implements standard dress for all students, which is a vital step toward furthering excellence and better preparing our students to dress for success for college, their careers, and life as adults. It is designed to ensure a safe and positive climate and the best environment for learning.

Administrative discretion will be given for all dress decisions. Anything that is deemed to be distracting in the classroom/school environment will not be allowed. The principal shall have the right to appraise any current fashion or fad and determine whether it fits within the standard dress guidelines.

DRESSES

- Dresses must have sleeves and be at least mid-thigh.

TOPS

- Collared, polo or oxford-style dress shirts, turtlenecks or knit-collared shirts and sweaters and sweatshirts must either be collared, solid, or patterned (plaid or striped only) with no words/logo unless referencing Brewer/school, college or military.
- Shirts must fit appropriately.
- Brewer or school T-shirts in any color or College/military T-shirts
- Solid-colored T-shirts (The only T-shirts allowed that have a design are school/college/military. All other T-shirts with a design are not allowed.)

BOTTOMS

- Pants must fit appropriately and at the waist.
- Jeans or shorts, skirts, capris and jumpers in denim, tan or light khaki, navy, gray, white, brown or black
- Dockers® or similar style pants, dress pants, capris or shorts in tan or light khaki, navy, gray, white, brown or black
- Skirts, skorts and jumpers in tan or light khaki, navy, gray, white, brown, black or denim.
- Form-fitting garments such as leggings and spandex must be solid-colored tan or light khaki, navy, gray, white, brown or black.
Form-fitting garments such as leggings and spandex must be worn with an appropriate shirt, dress, skirt, jumper, etc. that is MID-THIGH.
- Joggers, sweats, warm-up pants in tan or light khaki, navy, gray, white, brown or black (athletic shorts are not allowed)

- Shorts, skirts, jumpers and skorts are mid-thigh or longer.

GRADES PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 4 ONLY

- Girls must wear shorts under dresses, skirts and jumpers (i.e. cheer shorts)
- Maximum shoe height is 2 inches.

SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS

- Students who have a special need may apply for a waiver. Waivers will be evaluated and approved by the building principal.

OTHER GUIDELINES

- Students shall not wear inappropriate make-up, distracting accessories, or hazardous jewelry. Any items worn that cause a disruption or safety hazard are not allowable (i.e. grills, spacers, etc.).
- Students participating in physical education class/athletics must wear athletic footwear to participate.
- Principals/the district may designate certain days per year as spirit days and will determine what can be worn on those days.
- Royal blue spirit days will be held on Fridays, and all T-shirts must be royal blue. In the event that Friday is a holiday, Royal blue spirit day will be the Thursday immediately prior.

UNACCEPTABLE

Administrative discretion will be given for all dress code decisions. Unacceptable items include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Sagging pants
- Sleeveless shirts, dresses or open back tops/dresses
- Shirts that are tight, low-cut or show cleavage or midriff
- Torn, cut/slashed material that reveals any area of the skin or undergarments is not recommended but if worn, must be worn with leggings.
- Hoods or headwear worn in building
- Oversized, sagging or baggy clothing
- Pajama pants or similar styles
- Athletic, soccer or boxer-style shorts
- Slits/kick pleats in skirts that extend above the knee
- Flip flops or athletic slides
- Aqua socks and non-athletic toe shoes
- Slippers, house shoes
- Skate shoes, Heelies®

2016-2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- All WSISD schools earned the state's highest academic accountability rating of Met Standard in 2016-17.
Liberty Elementary and North Elementary earned five distinctions: Academic Achievement in Reading/English, Academic Achievement Math, Top 25% Student Progress, Top 25% Closing Performance Gaps and Postsecondary Readiness.
The Fine Arts Academy earned three distinctions: Academic Achievement in Reading/English, Top 25% Student Progress, and Top 25% Closing Performance Gaps.
WSISD will receive its 2017-18 accountability ratings in the fall.

The success of the district's focus on early literacy, critical thinking through critical writing, and rigor and relevance for the past four years is evidenced by this spring's third and fourth grade STAAR scores – WSISD third and fourth graders improved in all tested subjects.

- Forty-seven Brewer High School students advanced to state in Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs including Culinary Arts, Audio/Visual Production, Photography, Family Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA), DECA, and Law Enforcement.
- Forty-nine Brewer athletes signed to play at the college level, the most in the district's history.
- Fourteen Brewer seniors earned the Seal of Biliteracy Award. The award recognizes students who have studied and attained proficiency in two or more languages by graduation.
- Tannahill Intermediate and Fine Arts Academy sixth grade GLO students won three awards at TWU's Edible Car Contest.
- Blue Haze Elementary's Destination Imagination Team won first place at Regionals.

- Children at Risk recognized Liberty Elementary as the #1 Top Gold Ribbon Elementary School. Gold Ribbon Schools demonstrate high achievement despite a high population of economically disadvantaged students.
- Brewer High School junior Bella Clark won the highest award, Grand Championship Showmanship, during the Fort Worth Stock Show's Texas MADE Ag Mechanics Show.
- Fourteen Brewer Band students won awards at the 2017 State Competition.



More than 200 students throughout the district and of various ages participated in Brewer High School's 2nd annual school-wide musical, "Oliver."

- Brewer track team members advanced to regionals, and a cross country runner advanced to state in 2016-17.
- All Brewer High boys' team sports advanced to the playoffs.
- WSISD is expanding and enhancing its Career and Technical Education (CTE) program district-wide.
After-school CTE clubs (pictured below) were offered at two elementary schools this year.

Teachers are implementing coding and robotics beginning at the elementary levels so students are exposed early to this sought-after field.

Four WSISD schools now have Makerspace classrooms,

which provide students with an opportunity to explore their interests, learn to use tools and materials, and develop products.



The Brewer High School Wind Ensemble won the highest UIL award at the Region 30 UIL Concert and Sight Reading Competition.

For the second consecutive year, the band won the highest possible rating at the Region 30 UIL Marching Competition.

And, the Indoor Drumline won first place in its class in its first year to compete.

- North Elementary teacher Keyan Brady was among 24 teachers in the nation selected to serve on the 2017 Scholastic Reading Club Teacher Advisory Board.



& ACHIEVEMENTS

The number of CTE course offerings and career pathways at Brewer High School has doubled.

This summer, WSISD will expand Brewer's CTE facility by constructing a new 13,000-square foot Ag Science Barn, which will allow for the expansion of the agricultural programs and enable students to raise pigs, goats and cattle.

In addition, Brewer Middle will offer a coding course through the Information Technology Program.

- The WSISD Education Foundation awarded \$37,000 in grants to educators in 2016-17.

ONLINE REGISTRATION VERIFICATION REQUIRED FOR RETURNING STUDENTS

Parents will receive an email from the district's online student registration/data validation system (Skyward) in late July/early August so families can complete the online, returning student registration process for the 2017-18 school year. The link will also be posted on the home page of the website, www.wsisd.com.

The system allows WSISD to verify all student demographic, emergency and medical information for your child prior to the start of the school year.

Parents who need assistance with the online registration process or who do not have access to the Internet, may attend registration at their child's

campus. Parents who no longer have a valid email address in the system should contact the child's school beginning Aug. 3.

New Students

Parents must bring one copy of the following documents on the day of registration: birth certificate, immunization record, Social Security card, and proof of residency in the form of a current utility bill or lease/mortgage agreement.

Copies of birth certificates, shot records, and Social Security cards will be placed in the student's permanent file. Each new student will also need to present his/her most recent report card.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Please provide updated records to the school during registration dates.

DPT/Tdap

- 4 doses for pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood program
- 5 doses for kindergarten through 6th grades
- 1 dose on or after 4th birthday
- 4 doses if 4th dose is on or after 4th birthday
- 1 Tdap dose due when entering seventh grade if it's been five years since last dose of tetanus-containing vaccine
- 1 Tdap dose for grades 8 through 12 if it's been 10 years since receiving a prior tetanus-containing vaccine

POLIO/IPV

- 3 doses for pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood program
- 4 doses for kindergarten through 12th grades, with one dose on or after the 4th birthday
- 3 doses if last dose is after 4th birthday

MMR (Measles, Mumps & Rubella)

- 1 dose for pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood program.
- 2 doses upon entering kindergarten through 12th grades
- 1st dose on or after first birthday

HEPATITIS B

- 3 doses upon entering pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood programs and kindergarten through 12th grades

VARICELLA (chicken pox)

- 1 dose for pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood program
- 2 doses for kindergarten through 12th grades
- 1st dose on or after 1st birthday

MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE

- 1 dose upon entering 7th through 12th grades
- Proof of 1 dose of MCV4 or MenACWY required on or after 11th birthday

HEPATITIS A

- 2 doses upon entering pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood programs and kindergarten through 8th grades
- 1st dose on or after the 1st birthday.

HAEMOPHILUS INFLUENZA TYPE B (Hib)

- 3 doses upon entering pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood programs for 3 and 4 year olds or 1 dose on or after 15 months of age

PCV (Pneumococcal Disease)

- 4 doses upon entering pre-k, Head Start or other early childhood programs or 1 dose on or after 24 months of age
